OUR IRRIGATION JOURNEY

THE PAST

1400ha dryland at Woodbury.

2500 head self-replacing ewe flock.

Some dryland poppies.

Also operated 1100ha at York Plains, running similar enterprise mix.



THE PRESENT

4000ha spread between Woodbury and Campbell Town.

9500 head self-replacing ewe flock.

Irrigated cropping focusing on poppies and grass seed.

Poppies were 50% of turnover for 2012/13, now 12%.

650ha irrigation under 10 pivots and one linear.



INTEGRATING IRRIGATION AND PRIME LAMBS

Key factors

1: DRY MATTER PRODUCTION

Simple: 1ML irrigation water = 3t DM brassica

1ML irrigation water = 1t DM grass

2: RISK

"The biggest risk to our business is now not capitalising on a good season, as against managing a bad season."

Plan, implement, execute.



TYING IT ALL TOGETHER

- 1. Don't irrigate ryegrass through the summer.
- 2. Poppies only one year in four.
- 3. Brassicas are best
- 4. Focus on margin per day first.
- 5. Refine rotation.






TYING IT ALL TOGETHER

- Poppies harvested 15 January 2018.
- Sown to leafy turnip 16 January 2018. Grazed for 80 days at 35 lambs per hectare until 20 May.
- Hybrid canola seed sown 28 May, harvested 5 January 2019.
- Now grass seed crop.

Gross margin July 2017 – April 2019 >\$6000/ha


LOOKING FORWARD

- 1. More pivots.
- 2. Underground power.
- 3. Automation.
- 4. EID ewe lambs.
- 5. Refine rotation.
- 6. Soil mapping.


LOOKING FORWARD / LOOKING BACK
