


#### The PDS Trial — objective

- Profitability and best practice management for finishing lambs under irrigation
  - Comparing rotationally grazed with set stocked and clover with ryegrass
  - Animal health management
  - Liveweight gain
  - Stocking rates and dry matter production





#### The PDS Trial — pasture results


Daily DM eaten vs pasture growth rates by month for the rotation treatments



 Relationship between amount grown and amount eaten for both clover and ryegrass




#### The PDS Trial — pasture results



- For clover LWG is related to amount eaten
- For ryegrass no relationship between LWG and amount eaten (quality)




 Set stocking grazing systems limit ability to capitalise on spring pasture flush

### The PDS Trial — profitability

#### Top three take-home messages

- 1. Easier to make good money from clover than grass when finishing lambs BUT need to consider grazing options for the other six months of the year
- 2. To get best performance out of pastures need to be measuring and monitoring and responding to what you're observing
- 3. Chicken and egg of increasing SR and increasing pasture production
